

FLORA REZNIK

Flora Reznik (1986) is a visual artist, researcher, curator and filmmaker. Flora's practice is shaped by artistic research. Her projects are non medium bound and often incorporate video, text and performance in the context of installations, interdisciplinary events or publications. She is currently busy with fictional narratives as a means to incorporate historical, philosophical and field research. She investigates underlying metaphysical assumptions that shape our world, in particular in relation to territory and political agency. Her questions revolve around literature, belief and myth as an underlying force for what is considered "knowledge", in particular in regards to the notions of progress, nature and scientific certainties. She is also concerned with practicing storytelling as a mode of creating time and space for listening. Flora Reznik was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, where she obtained a Diploma in Philosophy (Universidad de Buenos Aires) and co-founded the Contemporary Arts Magazine CIA, directed by Roberto Jacoby. Currently she is based in The Hague, The Netherlands, where she studied at ArtScience Interfaculty, in the Royal Academy of Art. She has shown her work in various visual art festivals and museums in The Netherlands and abroad. Her first feature documentary film premiered in the Buenos Aires Independent Film Festival (2018) and obtained a prize from the Argentinian National Fund for the Arts. Collaboration and facilitating interdisciplinary learning and conversation is essential to Reznik's practice. Together with Sissel Marie Tonn, she co-organized the project The Reading Room, a series of events engaging artists with scholars in a mutual exchange of knowledge, taking place at Page Not Found. She was the artistic director and co-curator of the performative-symposium Unknown Grounds, whose second iteration will take place in June 2022. She initiated the publication series project "Script for a Synthetic Play", published by Onomatopoe Projects in March 2022 and 2024. Since 2021 is busy with the long term project "New Worlders", taking shape as a series of installations, publications, and a feature film. The latest outcome of this project was "Rio das Mortes", an experimental short film now part of the Eye Filmmuseum catalogue. Currently into the last steps of production of "Atlas Maria", a short essay film that culminates a 5 years odyssey into the world of colonial legacies of the Amazon.

We became characters in an experimental play, exploring new ways to relate and engage. In the shelter of fiction, we were free from social habits, empowered to see ourselves not just as passive occupants, but as active architects, speculators, constructors, foundation inspectors, janitors and maintenance workers. Script for a Synthetic Play: The Public Building features texts by Hamja Ahsan, Lila Athanasiadou, Nina Glockner, Ribal al-Khatib, Anna Moreno, Flora Reznik, Nishant Shah, and Eef Veldkamp. These contributions were shared before the event of the symposium, providing a virtual prelude to the conversations that unfolded and invited readers to co-create a communal space even before stepping into it. It also includes a fictionalized wrap-up discussion presented as a script, offering a fresh take on the ancient Greek comedy genre, drawing from its capacity to create a space for democratic, critical reflection on our political systems.

A young researcher retraces the steps of her (my) aunt Maria Reznik, who in 1943 became one of the first white women to explore the South Amazon by joining expedition Roncador-Xingu. Along the way, the researcher encounters a political movement that sees opportunity in the imminent collapse of the new gene-edited rubber industry, not a catastrophe. A mutant fungus known for attacking rubber plantations becomes an ally. Riverine creatures (human, nonhuman and the narrative) are affected by its sexual spores, which not only kill but also regenerate.

	<p>research based speculative sci-fi story, in which personal explorations of family ties are interwoven with larger colonial histories, connected to processes like industrialization and global trade. A young researcher, a Jewish Argentinian woman living in the near future, learns about her aunt being one of the firsts to explore the Amazon, and wonders about what took her to the unknown. Through a fictional journey, she delves into the sexualised and violent narratives that haunt our imagination about that place: like worms in the skulls of the dead, like dreams in the minds of the living. This film is an attempt to create a different narrative, by simultaneously telling the tale of the history and future of rubber, a hidden backbone of the global economy. The rubber industry is very much at the edge of collapse due to a mutant fungus that attacks rubber plantations. An interspecies alliance with this fungus might be a way to overcome gene-edited resistant rubber trees, and bring back the wild distribution of rubber trees, scattered across the landscape. New Worlders concerns biopiracy in times of genetic engineering, the scope of synthetic fantasies, global production chains of supply, ecology, scientific innovation and resistance. The researcher sets out to retrace the steps of her great aunt, Maria Reznik, who in the 1940s left her job as a stenographer (a fast typing technology used to transcribe speech in shorthand, usually in court reports), and became one of the first white women to explore the Southern Amazon. She joined the Roncador-Xingu Expedition, a State initiative known for mapping the interior of Brazil and for "pacifying" the indigenous peoples, which led to decimation of the population and devastation of the environment.</p>

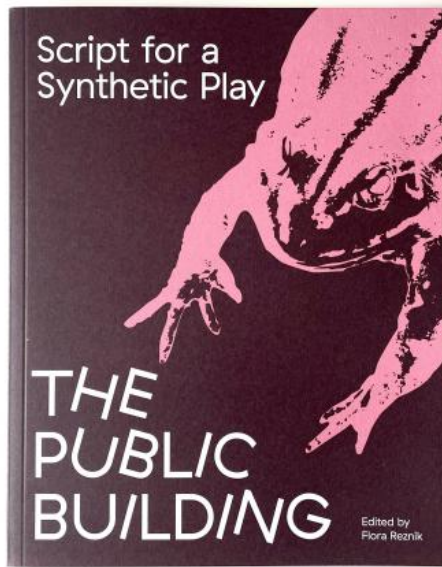

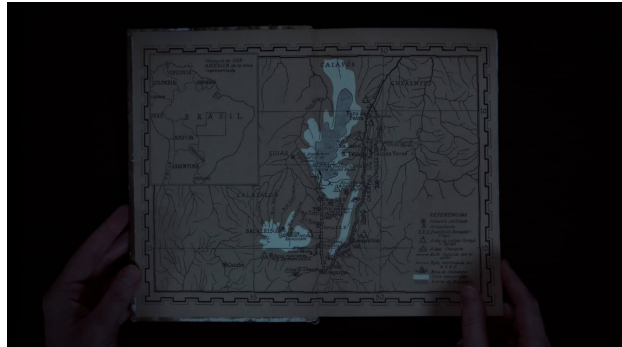

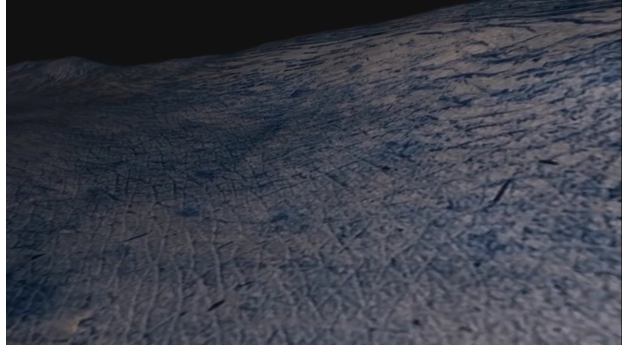
